First Semester (or 0-15 credit hours)

Pertaining to Educational Planning (Advising) complete the following:

- Clearly understand the add/drop process and refund policy (https://www.cod.edu/costs/refunds/).
- Schedule an appointment (https://www.cod.edu/student_life/ resources/counseling/) with your counselor or program advisor to develop your one-year academic plan.
 - · Confirm your program.
 - · Discuss career and transfer options.
 - · Review/learn program map.
- If undecided, discuss career exploration (https://www.cod.edu/ student_life/resources/counseling/career-counseling/) with a counselor.
- · Register (https://www.cod.edu/registration/) for next semester!
- Sign up for payment plan (https://cod.edu/paymentplan/) if applicable (review payment plan policy (https://cod.edu/paymentpolicy/)).
